

### From Your Interim Pastor :

I keep hearing people ask, "When will we return to normal?" The real question might be what is normal? Good Shepherd hasn't had anything near "normal" for months now. And I don't think that will change any time soon. I do expect us to be able to re-open the church in the near future. But, much of that will depend on how we are willing to move forward with appropriate precautions. While the number of virus cases may be starting to decline and has never been dramatic numbers in the Walterboro area, we still have no known treatment and inadequate testing in place. Until those things are in commonly available, we will have to proceed with social distancing practices and very careful thought to whatever ways we gather.

Since I also pastor at St. John's in Beaufort, I have experienced death due to Covid-19 and the disruption of members needing to quarantine. None of us want to see any of our members and good friends face those circumstances. And let's be honest----a significant number in our community fall in that high-risk profile. At the same time, we all yearn for the opportunity to be back together face to face. We know that our Food Bank recipients need us. We know that we are stronger and better together in our fellowship. And who doesn't want to be able to feast on Spaghetti, BBQ, or those other luscious goodies our women and men cook up?

Your Executive Committee has determined that we need to continue what we are currently doing at least until mid-May. We're watching for the 2 factors cited by the White House team----a reduction in reported cases for 14 consecutive days and significantly increased testing. In the meantime, we'll continue to offer what we have been doing along with continued contacting to be sure everyone is okay. Let's hope the time passes quickly and we all remain safe and healthy.

Even with the limitations in place, spring in the low country is a favorite time of year for me. The whole of creation comes alive, giving testimony to the resurrection all around us. It seems like something is blooming all the time. The temperatures are magnificent this time of year. Remember, I spent 36 years in Minnesota where spring lasted 2-3 weeks! Yes, it will get hot again----but I plan on never again going outside to a minus 30 temp. It seems to me that we can either consider our present situation as a problem or an opportunity. I prefer to think of the later. My wife and I have had wonderful quality time together and we've also allowed one another to have our own time. We've also had long talks with loved ones, more frequent than normal, which has been lovely. When we're back together I hope many of you will have some lovely show-and-tell things to share.

In the meantime, give thanks for each day----pray for all those who need our support----and continue to bless one another with your well wishes and graceful living.

#### April Executive Committee meeting notes : 04-21-2020

- The officers of church Council met, along with Pastor Craig, using the Zoom on-line meeting program to discuss plans for Good Shepherd for the month of May. The committee decided to continue not meeting face-to-face at the church and to reevaluate the situation at the next Council meeting scheduled for Sunday, May 17. That will be a Zoom meeting.
- Jon notified the committee that the SC Synod assembly has been rescheduled for Saturday, July 25, at St. Stephen's Lutheran in Lexington. This year's assembly will be at a oneday business meeting from 10:00 a.m. until 8:30 p.m.
- Kevin let the committee know that Diane will be sending out Lutheroad registration information to families of young people who are eligible to attend camp this year. If NovusWay cancels the camp due to the Corona virus, the registration money will be reimbursed to the families. Lutheroad is scheduled for the week of July 20 at Good Shepherd.

Your Council members are Jon Carpenter, Angela Crosby, Shannon Guess and Kevin Wicker.


### **Financial Corner:**
