From Your Interim Pastor:

This last week on the drive up to Walterboro my wife read to me the history of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. I had read it some time ago, but in hearing it again I was struck by the determination and dedication of the founders and long time members of this congregation. They faced tremendous challenges---from the dizzying numbers of pastors who served them in their early years, trying to build a building in the midst of a world war, having a couple of springs sprout in the basement of their fellowship hall. It's been an amazing 80 years, even if we had to postpone celebrating it in September.

This year will add some additional interesting chapters to that story. Nowhere in the past was their talk of needing to close the church facilities for months on end, canceling more activities and ministries than in our entire history. We'll be able to write of how we learned to worship electronically----mailing out bulletins and sermons----and several months outside under the portico (what a blessing it has been to have that structure take on new significance. When all is said and done, we may need to give that portico a name!

As we move into the winter months, you'll read elsewhere in this newsletter of the council's decision to move back into the sanctuary with significant, detailed precautions for keeping everyone safe. We've all read of Covid outbreaks from church gatherings in other communities. The last thing we want is for one of our own to be hospitalized on a ventilator. So, understand that we want to be extra careful in everything we do. I thank you in advance for your thoughtful compliance. And for those who still

don't feel safe, we'll continue to send out those bulletins and broadcast on Zoom each week.

In November we'll say goodbye to those many Sundays after Pentecost----that part of the church year that focuses on our life as followers of Christ. On November 1st we celebrate All Saints Sunday as we remember those who have passed on from us to God in the previous 12 months as well as all who have served as models of faith for us. On November 22nd it's Christ the King Sunday---- the last Sunday of the church year and the celebrating of the final victory that awaits us all. And on November 29th we begin the Advent season. Time sure flies by, even in a pandemic. November 1 also marks one year that I have been with you as your interim pastor. Who could have known a year ago what an unusual journey we'd be on? Thank you for your support and faithfulness for the sake of your church.

Church Council met at a "call meeting" on Sunday, October 25, to consider recommendations from the Worship and Music Committee for returning to indoor worship in the sanctuary. Council approved returning to indoor worship on Sunday, November 8, using the guidelines included in this newsletter.

EMPTY BOWLS 2020

It is with sadness and regret that The Lowcountry Empty Bowls group announces the cancellation of the 2020 program soup lunch/supper. The Coronavirus has made big changes in the lives of all of us. The CDC and others are still cautioning everyone to continue to take care now, to maintain social distancing measures, to wear masks, and to guard against needless exposure in large gatherings.

Because of our new "closed-down" world, our local food pantries are even more important. More families are living closer to the financial edge; more people, more children need help to avoid hunger. In order to help our community meet this need and to make up for the loss of the revenues normally generated by our event, we are asking everyone to send a check to Lowcountry Empty Bowls, P.O. Box 531, Walterboro, SC 29488. The monies will be collected and divided up among the food pantries of Bethel United Methodist Church, Cottageville Methodist Church, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, St Anthony's Catholic Church, and St Jude's Church, the five churches that have provided the soup, bread, desserts and servers for our past meals. We will continue this collection through December 31, 2020, so please give when and what you can.

We want to thank everyone who has made our past events so successful and look forward to resuming this wonderful program as soon as conditions allow. In the meantime, please keep safe and healthy!

A New Drop Box!

At their October meeting, members of church Council approved the addition of a drop box on the door of the Fellowship Hall. The drop box has been installed and is ready for items that you need to leave for the church office, including offering envelopes. Simply pull down the flap, insert your envelope,



close the flap, and open once again to make sure your item fell into the secure box inside the Hall.

Food Pantry

For the months of November and December we will have a **food drive to help support our food pantry** here at Good Shepherd. Our food pantry distributes food to those in need in our community. Currently donations of goods are needed instead of cash donations because of the inability to make bulk purchases at this time. We are asking for contributions of nonperishable food items such as cans of fruit cocktail, whole kernel corn, and cut green beans, boxes of saltines, bags of rice, spaghetti noodles, pasta sauce, ramen noodles, and peanut butter.

Good Shepherd Women:

The **Good Shepherd Women** will be meeting this month on Monday, November 2, at 6:30 pm at the church. This meeting will be BYOM (Bring Your Own Meal). We will have a brief business session followed by Bible study.

Christian Education:

The Christian Education committee will be meeting on Saturday, November 7, at 10:00 am via Zoom. We will be discussing plans for the children's service activity on Saturday, November 14, as well as plans for December. Please watch the bulletin, the website, and Facebook for further information.

Worship and Music

The Worship and Music Committee met after the worship service on Sunday, October 18, for the purpose of discussing plans to returning to worship in the sanctuary. A set of guidelines, as well as a start date, were discussed and referred to church council for approval.

We will be taking orders for **poinsettias for Christmas Eve**. An order form is included in this newsletter. The deadline for ordering is Sunday, December 6, 2020. Please make all checks payable to Good Shepherd and note "poinsettias" on the memo line.

October Council meeting notes: 10-11-2020

Amy Rusnak opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

- 1. The Pastor's report, financial report, Good Shepherd WELCA report, and Christian Ed Committee report were received as information.
- Carl Lindstrom attended the meeting via Zoom to report on the Property Committee. The assessment of the parsonage repair needs is ongoing.
- 3. Charlotte Brinson attended the meeting via Zoom to report on the Food Pantry. The Food Pantry was open two days during September, but securing large quantities of food to support the distribution effort has been an issue for the committee members.
- 4. Council approved a request by the Good Shepherd Women of the ELCA to host a "take-out" spaghetti dinner on Saturday, February 13, 2021.
- 5. Council approved a gift of \$200 to St. Anthony's Catholic Church, from our Social Ministry funds, to support their community Thanksgiving Dinner project.
- 6. Council approved the purchase and installation of a drop box on the Fellowship Hall door to provide a safe place to drop off offerings or other material for the church. The cost of the box will be taken from our Thirvent Choice Dollars account.
- 7. Council approved recording the Council meetings on Zoom for use by the Secretary and for any member who misses the meeting. The recording will be deleted approximately four weeks after the meeting due to storage space on "the cloud."
- 8. Members discussed the Congregational Sustainability Assessment form from the Synod that will be completed as part of the Call Process. Doug Lindstrom, Garrett Brinson, Dean Brinson and Kevin Wicker will work on that form prior to the November Council meeting.
- Members discussed the upcoming ballot for election of new Council members and how to administer that ballot in light of the Covid precautions.
- 10. Members also discussed resuming indoor worship, but decided to allow the Worship and Music committee time to meet and provide recommendations prior to the November Council meeting.


Last month we talked about completing the payback to the **Wallace Fund** for the Fellowship Hall roof, and beginning to repay the Fund for the parsonage HVAC replacement and sanctuary ceiling water damage repair. We have already begun receiving gifts for that purpose. You can monitor the progress of that effort each month in the diagram below. Currently, the balance owed to the Wallace Fund for those two projects is **\$11,310**.

Sanctuary Indoor Worship Resumes on Sunday, November 8, 2020.

Church Council met on October 25 and approved returning to indoor worship on Sunday, November 8. Council members also approved the following guidelines for indoor worship. Transmitting and recording of the service will continue using Zoom for those who prefer to worship from home.

- 1. All participants will be required to wear masks, which cover mouth and nose, to be admitted to the sanctuary and for the duration of the service.
- 2. If you do not feel well that morning, please do not come to church.
- 3. If anyone who attends worship, and thereafter tests positive within a week, they should notify Council Chair Jon Carpenter or Pastor Craig.
- 4. An usher will be present to do a temperature check of each person at the door and to offer hand sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.
- 5. Members and friends will be asked to stay outside until admitted to the sanctuary by the usher.
- 6. The ushers will constantly monitor the narthex and the sanctuary during the service to greet people who may enter during the service, check their temperature, offer hand sanitizer, take them to a suitable socially distanced seat, and to take care of any needs of the congregation.
- 7. Social distancing will be observed with seating in designated pews with assistance from an usher. (Pew cushions will be removed and selected pews will be marked off.)
- 8. There will be a table in the narthex where bulletins will be available for pick-up and an offering plate for the placement of offerings.
- 9. The water fountain will be closed, but water bottles will be available.
- 10. Interior doors will be left open to eliminate the need to touch doors and door handles.
- 11. Each worshipper is responsible to use the spray sanitizer provided in the restroom after each use.
- 12. Outside doors will be left open, as weather permits, for better air circulation.
- 13. There will be no singing during the service while in the sanctuary. "Humming" will be encouraged.
- 14. Every effort will be made to keep the length of the service to 40 minutes or less.
- 15. Worshipers will be asked to turn off their smartphones WiFi feature or place them in "airplane" mode so as to not use the limited WiFi that we'll be using for Zoom.
- 16. The sanctuary will be closed for 48 hours following each service.

Note: The ushers will need to arrive 20 minutes before worship to check those in attendance as they arrive and direct them to their seats.
