## From Your Interim Pastor :

We've managed to healthily get by 3 plus months of being outdoors. I hear the eager hoping for a return to "normal". Let's first be clear that we won't be back to the way things used to be until we have a vaccine that has gotten wide distribution. Nonetheless, your Worship Committee is planning to meet October 10<sup>th</sup> to talk about our options going into fall and especially the holiday season.

We continue to learn more from schools resuming as well as some churches. Among the challenges are that indoor environments are much more risky than outdoor. We have strong recommendations for no singing indoors in addition to the social distancing and masking. While sanitizing surfaces remains a concern, the bigger threat is the airborne virus. Even tiny aerosol particles present a significant risk.

This, of course, means that those most at risk need to remain very vigilant. But all of us need to fight the lapses that naturally can happen when we're at this for such a long time. But Jesus warned his disciples in Matthew 10:16, "See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. "Jesus wasn't specifically talking about a pandemic, but evil takes all kinds of forms, and I certainly think of this virus as an enemy of all that is good. We have already had at least one Good Shepherd family deal with Covid-19 and while everyone has come through it, they would tell you that it is nothing to take lightly.

A few of our members can still remember World War II and the Korean War. More remember the racial unrest of the 1960's and even more the attacks of September 11<sup>th</sup>. In each case, we

Americans rallied together to meet the challenges and find our way through. We will do that again. But it does require that we pull together, draw on our faith and fortitude, and treat one another with grace. This time around we have a common enemy across the whole world. Let's hope looking back that we discovered new ways to be community and this all ended up for good.

In the meantime, we are starting to encourage small groups of people to consider ways they can meet face to face. Our confirmation class has met, socially distanced and masked in the fellowship hall multiple times now. We think other groups could do the same. In late October we're planning a "Trunk or Treat" out in the parking lot. In October I hope to bring some home communions to people's porches. All of this serves as glimmers of hope in what has been a long darkness. Find ways to light your candles and pray for that brighter future.



## September Council meeting notes : 09-10-2020

Shannon opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

1. With the cost of the Fellowship Hall roof repaid to the Wallace Fund, Council approved the repayment of the parsonage HVAC and Church ceiling repair to the Wallace Fund. That value is \$12,060.
2. Pastor Craig continued leading our discussion of the call process. The Synod office is sending some work sheets that the Council members will need to complete next month.
3. Worship and Music will meet on October 11 following worship and will return to Council with recommendations for worshipping inside the sanctuary.
4. The roofing materials are on site to re-roof the parsonage. There will be a minor increase in the cost to replace the roof due to escalating material costs.
5. Council approved the Property Committee to do a complete assessment of the parsonage repairs and upgrades and to bring that assessment back to Council for consideration.
6. Council approved the landing of an air-ambulance helicopter in our parking lot for the Marshall Catterton Memorial Blood Drive on September 24.
7. There was a lengthy discussion of the Food Pantry reopening. The Food Pantry Team will consider some of the options and return their ideas to the Council next month.
8. Council approved the use of the Fellowship Hall on October 26 and 27 for the Colleton Medical Center Auxiliary's annual sale with guidance on best practices to avoid spread of the virus.

## Financial Corner:

I'm excited to let you know that we have officially paid our Wallace Fund back for the loan to replace the roof on the Fellowship hall in 2018. This is indeed good news. But, that challenge continues. At their September meeting, Council members agreed that they would like for us to strive to repay the Wallace Fund for the church ceiling repairs (2015) and the parsonage Heating and Air Conditioning replacement (2017). The total of those two items that we "borrowed" from the Wallace Fund was \$12,060. So, you'll see those items displayed each month on the chart in the "Financial Corner."

You'll also note that the tornado damaged parsonage roof was replaced in September. The insurance money to cover that claim was set aside in savings, and approved by the congregation, so that money will not have to come from the Wallace Fund.


