

From Your Interim Pastor :

The primary theme for the Advent season is anticipation. This year we've had plenty of anxiety----and now we begin to hope for these vaccines that seem to be near approval. It's a ray of hope in what has otherwise been a pretty dismal year. Surrounded by continual bad news about illness and death, we've also endured horrendous fires and a record hurricane season. I know that the folks on the Louisiana coast and those on either side are totally worn out. I grieve for the people of Nicaragua. Having spent time teaching and visiting rural parishes there, I know how fragile and vulnerable their existence is even in the best of times. And close to home, communities near us are still putting back the pieces from that tornado months ago.

Advent calls us to live with hope even in the worst of times. And difficult as this year has been----for most of us this has not been any where near as bad as it could have been. People in Old Testament Israel clung to the promises of a messiah even as they saw their promised land overrun by foreign armies. They had been slaves in Egypt and again had become exiles and slaves in Babylon. Generations had lived with only the hope that God would again someday deliver them. And when Jesus came, it was into a world ruled by the Roman Empire. They were experts at maintaining control so that no one dared hope for a different future.

When Jesus came into the world, it was in a way that few recognized or understood. The Jewish vision for a mighty king like David was not the way that God would choose to intervene in the world this time. This has to make us wonder what to expect when Christ comes again. The scriptures say we won't know the

day or the hour. It suggests that it will be a total surprise for most------frightening for the lost-----and amazing for those who call upon the Lord.

So, Advent calls us to remember the promises----to cultivate hope even in desperate times----and to anticipate that the day of the Lord is at hand. As my sermons last month talked about judgment, it is not anything we are to fear as people of faith. Stay focused. Put first things first. Keep the faith.

On the more immediate front, Good Shepherd will be looking more in earnest for your next pastor in the coming year. As we return to life after Covid (or at least, with the virus becoming contained), we hope to return to some semblance of normalcy. Activities and relationships can be renewed. We'll begin to feel at ease and eager for our future. As a congregation we can talk about what we hope for. So, as Advent is a time of hope and anticipation, we have much to look for in the future. May God's light shine in the darkness, and bring renewed hope to all the world.

November Council meeting notes : 11-8-2020

Pastor Craig opened the meeting with prayer.

- 1. Council members decided to begin the 2021-2023 Council election process on Sunday, November 22 and to mail ballots to members not in attendance at church due to concerns of Covid-19.
- 2. In a report from the Good Shepherd Women of the ELCA, Council acknowledged that the LMM/WELCA Christmas dinner will be canceled this yeardue to concerns of Covid-19.
- 3. At the recommendation of the Worship and Music Committee, the Council approved the purchase of a new Chrismon tree for the sanctuary in memory of Arden and Mary Lommen.
- 4. Also at the request of the Worship and Music Committee, the Council discussed alternate times for the Christmas Eve candlelight service. There being no particular feelings about the worship time, Council sent that decision back to Worship and Music for consideration.
- 5. Council members discussed in detail the Congregational Sustainability Assessment that had been completed by a sub-committee of the Council since the last meeting. This assessment is part of the Call Process and will be

forwarded to Bishop Aebischer for review and discussion. There being no further business, the meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Craig.

Financial Corner:



Sanctuary Indoor Worship Guidelines during Covid-19

- 1. All participants will be required to wear masks, which cover mouth and nose, to be admitted to the sanctuary and for the duration of the service.
- 2. If you do not feel well that morning, please do not come to church.
- 3. If anyone who attends worship, and thereafter tests positive within a week, they should notify Council Chair Jon Carpenter or Pastor Craig.
- 4. An usher will be present to do a temperature check of each person at the door and to offer hand sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.
- 5. Members and friends will be asked to stay outside until admitted to the sanctuary by the usher.
- 6. The ushers will constantly monitor the narthex and the sanctuary during the service to greet people who may enter during the service, check their temperature, offer hand sanitizer, take them to a suitable socially distanced seat, and to take care of any needs of the congregation.
- 7. Social distancing will be observed with seating in designated pews with assistance from an usher. (Pew cushions will be removed and selected pews will be marked off.)
- 8. There will be a table in the narthex where bulletins will be available for pick-up and an offering plate for the placement of offerings.
- 9. The water fountain will be closed, but water bottles will be available.
- 10. Interior doors will be left open to eliminate the need to touch doors and door handles.
- 11. Each worshipper is responsible to use the spray sanitizer provided in the restroom after each use.
- 12. Outside doors will be left open, as weather permits, for better air circulation.
- 13. There will be no singing during the service while in the sanctuary. "Humming" will be encouraged.
- 14. Every effort will be made to keep the length of the service to 40 minutes or less.
- 15. Worshipers will be asked to turn off their smartphones WiFi feature or place them in "airplane" mode so as to not use the limited WiFi that we'll be using for Zoom.
- 16. The sanctuary will be closed for 48 hours following each service.
- **Note:** The ushers will need to arrive 20 minutes before worship to check those in attendance as they arrive and direct them to their seats.
