From Your Interim Pastor:

Can you believe Lent is already coming this month? It seems like we've barely put away the Christmas decorations. Of course, Easter comes pretty early this year on April 4. Right now, it appears we'll be able to have Easter services, but certainly still with heightened safety protocols. But we're still making adjustments to keep everyone protected. The tradition of Shrove (or Fat) Tuesday with a pancake supper and sausages will have to happen in our homes this year. We'll have a brief Zoom service at 7 pm to mark the occasion. We will be doing an in-person Ash Wednesday service (also Zoomed) but then our Thursday midweek events will all be virtual this year.

For Lent this year the Worship Committee concurred with my suggestion of a focus on the Lutheran Catechism, which is teaching the basics of our faith. On the five Sundays of Lent prior to Palm Sunday we'll look at the Ten Commandments. On Thursday evenings we'll have Zoom gatherings focusing on the creed, the sacraments, and the Lord's Prayer. For those unable to Zoom we'll have the Sunday sermons and summaries of the Thursday presentations available by email or mailed to those who normally receive those.

We have ordered a number of copies of Luther's Small Catechism for those who want to use the book to follow along. They will be available to pick up in the church narthex. Those who grew up in the Lutheran church will find some of this will jog old memories. For those from other traditions, the catechism is a basic summary of Christian teachings which will serve as either a refresher or an introduction to the basics of the faith.

On another note, we're beginning to see the roll out of the Covid vaccines. Georgia and I have a Feb. 19th appointment for the first shots. So far, the process has been a bit chaotic, but let's exercise some patience for this mammoth undertaking. The vaccines are our pathway back to some semblance of normal. Having gone through this pandemic, the "new" normal may be adjusted from what we remember. We move into the future confident of God's leading and hopeful for that new day.

Wow! What a year 2020 was!! Financially, we had a solid year. Our total General Fund donations were down about \$7,000 from 2019, but with the impact of Covid on our donors and church, that may be considered a minor miracle. And, we were able to exceed the needs of our 2020 Spending Plan for Ministry and repay ourselves almost \$27,000 to the Wallace Fund.

So now we are ready to embark on 2021. Your Council has approved a **2021 Spending Plan for Ministry** and we will have a **Congregational meeting following worship on February 7** to act upon that motion from Council. As much as 2020 was a year of change and challenge, we hope 2021 will be also, but for the better. So, our Spending Plan for 2021 will be one of preparing to resume our Ministry to a little more "normal" mode of operation.



The **Ash Wednesday service** will be held on Wednesday, February 17, at 7:00 pm at the church. The service will also be available via Zoom. We will have imposition of ashes and communion as a part of the service. The theme for Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday, will be Luther's Small Catechism. The Sunday services will look at the Ten Commandments, and the midweek services will look at other parts of Luther's Small Catechism. For the midweek services, we will not have soup suppers. Instead, the Thursday midweek services will be at 7:00 pm via Zoom.

Lily orders will be taken through the month of February. Information about Easter lilies can be found on the order form included with this newsletter. The deadline for ordering Easter lilies is Sunday, March 7, 2021.

The Worship and Music Committee will meet after worship on Sunday, February 28, 2021. We will be discussing plans for Holy Week and Easter.
