From Your Interim Pastor :

We ring in the new year with signs of hope. At least two vaccines may help us get this pandemic behind us. We've managed to hold things together, but what a challenge it has been. Your church council leadership is incredibly grateful for your ongoing financial support and encouragement. We started 2020 with lots of optimism but this virus brought closures and unusual adaptations when we did start having in person worship. Our service ministries were curtailed for months, as well as all those social and educational events that bring vitality and joy to our faith lives. Our hopes for new visitors and former attenders returning took a huge hit and visitation of members has been suspended, given the risks. 2020 was not what any of us envisioned. While at least seven members of our Good Shepherd community have contracted the virus, thankfully all have recovered.

There have been brighter moments. Our portico became a very workable outdoor setting as we tried to keep everyone safe. We're still using it to allow for some limited singing that is strongly discouraged indoors. We've been able to do a few events like "trunk of treat" and a few children's activities. Confirmation resumed with 3 teens and 3 adults---a really fun combination. And as you'll read in the treasurer's report, generous giving has allowed paying back significant past borrowing to stabilize the church's finances.

One member asked me when we were going to release the "Alleluias" from the box by the altar. Remember that we put away the alleluias back at the start of Lent in 2020. The plan was to release them on Easter, when we could sing them joyfully again. Well, Covid happened and Easter happened in lockdown mode.

All this year it has seemed inappropriate to release those shouts of joy in the midst of such pain. As it says in Psalm 137:4, "How can we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?" Those words come from when the Israelites were captive in Babylonian exile, yet they seem strikingly appropriate for the exile we've felt from one another, homebound or masked and restrained.

The day is coming when we'll sing without masks, welcome back the immune compromised, and open our doors to all. The days are coming when the women and men will be cooking up delicious meals, when we'll hear the sounds of Wonderful Wednesdays, Special Gathering will feel safe to reconvene, and the box will be opened! In the meantime, we hold fast to staying safe. We keep reaching out to one another. We have made it this far---we'll get to the alleluias soon enough!

Financial Corner

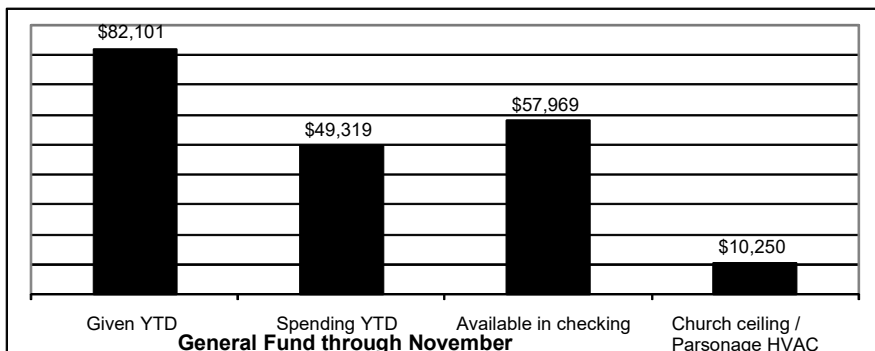
At their meeting in December, your church Council approved moving \$26,700 from the checking account to the **Margaret Wallace Fund** to “pay back” the Fund for the money we took in 2014, 2016 and 2017 to support the operating expenses of Good Shepherd. This is only possible because, despite the challenges of 2020, you have been strong and faithful in your gifts to Good Shepherd. Your gifts are significant because we needed to build a cash reserve for the ministry and operating expenses of Good Shepherd, but also because we have expenses facing us to make necessary repairs and upgrades to the parsonage and to replace the church air conditioning and heating units. You may also note in the graph below that we are making good progress in “paying back” the Wallace Fund for the church ceiling damage repair in 2015 and the parsonage HVAC unit in 2017.

Thank you all so much for your continuing support of the ministry of Good Shepherd. As always, if you have questions concerning the finances of Good Shepherd, please give me a call.

December Council meeting notes : 12-13-2020

The meeting was opened with prayer by Garrett Brinson.

1. Council approved transferring \$26,700 from our checking account to the **Margaret Wallace Fund** to reimburse the Fund for operating expenses taken from the Wallace Fund in 2014, 2016 and 2017.
2. Council heard a report from **Property Committee** chair, Carl Lindstrom, on the condition of the church HVAC and options for replacing those two units. After much discussion, Council directed this back to the Property Committee with guidance to proceed with acquiring bids.
3. Carl Lindstrom also reported that the Property Committee is planning replacement of soil in the parsonage back yard after the first of the year.
4. Council approved Christmas gifts for Linda Gilgen, Glenn Williams and Diane Wicker.
5. Jon reported that the **Mutual Ministry Committee** has completed the one-year assessment of the Pastor and will be presenting that to Pastor Craig soon.
6. Amy Rusnak reported on the Christmas gift buying spree, by members of the **Good Shepherd Women of the ELCA**, for needy children in the community in conjunction with Bethel Presbyterian Church.
7. Council approved the transfer of Ms. Kim Miller's membership from Good Shepherd to Bethel Presbyterian Church.
8. Pastor Craig and Jon Carpenter reported that they have spoken with Bishop Aebischer regarding **the Call Process**.
9. Council discussed the **2021 Spending Plan for Ministry**. Kevin Wicker will provide more information for the January meeting.
10. Council recognized, and thanked **Angela Crosby** for her service on Council for the past six years. Angela has served as Secretary and Vice Chair of Council, and has been a member of the Executive Committee and Mutual Ministry Committee during her time on Council.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Angela Crosby.

Sanctuary Indoor Worship Guidelines during Covid-19

1. All participants will be required to wear masks, which cover mouth and nose, to be admitted to the sanctuary and for the duration of the service.
2. If you do not feel well that morning, please do not come to church.
3. If anyone who attends worship, and thereafter tests positive within a week, they should notify Council Chair Jon Carpenter or Pastor Craig.
4. An usher will be present to do a temperature check of each person at the door and to offer hand sanitizer before entering the sanctuary.
5. Members and friends will be asked to stay outside until admitted to the sanctuary by the usher.
6. The ushers will constantly monitor the narthex and the sanctuary during the service to greet people who may enter during the service, check their temperature, offer hand sanitizer, take them to a suitable socially distanced seat, and to take care of any needs of the congregation.
7. Social distancing will be observed with seating in designated pews with assistance from an usher. (Pew cushions will be removed and selected pews will be marked off.)
8. There will be a table in the narthex where bulletins will be available for pick-up and an offering plate for the placement of offerings.
9. The water fountain will be closed, but water bottles will be available.
10. Interior doors will be left open to eliminate the need to touch doors and door handles.
11. Each worshipper is responsible to use the spray sanitizer provided in the restroom after each use.
12. Outside doors will be left open, as weather permits, for better air circulation.
13. There will be no singing during the service while in the sanctuary. “Humming” will be encouraged.
14. Every effort will be made to keep the length of the service to 40 minutes or less.
15. Worshipers will be asked to turn off their smartphones WiFi feature or place them in “airplane” mode so as to not use the limited WiFi that we’ll be using for Zoom.
16. The sanctuary will be closed for 48 hours following each service.

Note: The ushers will need to arrive 20 minutes before worship to check those in attendance as they arrive and direct them to their seats.
