From the Pastor :

August signals a time when we squeeze in those last bits of summer leisure before school starts back and the fall routine kicks in. At Good Shepherd we'll have a few guest pastors as Georgia and I spend some vacation time in the Colorado Mountains and do my one Sunday at St. Johns in Beaufort. These are good opportunities for you to be exposed to a variety of preaching styles and appreciate the gifts of several different leaders. Toward the end of the month or early in September we'll receive the results from our Congregational Vitality Survey. Pastor Rick Carter and Bishop Aebischer will come to provide those results in person, likely at a midweek time. While the information alone will be interesting, we'll likely provide food as an added incentive to attend.

The call committee has been working on our Ministry Site Profile which will provide potential leaders with a detailed description of the life and mission of Good Shepherd. In some ways, I wish all of you could be involved in those discussions. They have been both inspiring and challenging. This congregation does so many things for being such a small community. But we face lots of challenges as both a church and a more rural community. The issue isn't so much survival as how do we thrive in an environment that seems to value other things. As we talked about challenges ahead, we noted that smaller communities like Walterboro really suffered from the pandemic. Our businesses already operated at a slimmer margin than those in higher population areas. Some have closed and may never come back. Likewise many laborers gravitated to the larger population centers where wages are higher. Certainly we want to be mindful of trying to support our local businesses as they work to recover.

I know many of you are eager to fully return to pre-pandemic routines. While the current virus infection rates are low in Colleton County, the threats of the Delta variant and other possible mutations have us being cautious and watchful. We have returned to singing in worship but continue to keep the service shortened by skipping some of the normal liturgy. Fellowship activities are returning as well, but still mindful of the need for care. The latest indications are that vaccines, while highly effective, probably won't be available to children under 12 for some months yet. Vaccine hesitancy also frustrates our efforts toward recovery.

But what have we learned in this last year and a half? Certainly we are discovering our resiliency and creativity. We have made adaptations and rolled with the punches in ways we would have never done in the normal routine. Streaming worship, adjusting how we do our service ministries, figuring out how to continue our teaching and children's outreach have all been remarkable. Our faith in God's love and grace are unwavering. Members are still helping one another, maybe more than ever. Maybe like the people of Israel wandering in the desert or in the Babylonian exile, our future may be even stronger and our faith more sure as a result of this experience.

There will be a small area set aside as a museum of their heritage. Chief Peter Parr and the entire tribe are very excited about what we are doing. One of the Chief's statements about our efforts this year was, "You just can't out do God."



July Council meeting notes: 7-11-2021

Council met following worship on Sunday, July 11, in the Fellowship Hall. Amy opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

1. Pastor Craig informed the Council that he is coming to Walterboro one day a week and making some home visits. Pastor also informed Council of his schedule for August and September.
2. Council approved that any “undesigned” funds that have been received in memory of **Mrs. Mary Lommen** be used for our **Lutherad Day Camp**.
3. Council accepted a second estimate from **Property Committee** chair, Carl Lindstrom, on prices for replacement windows for the parsonage. They also asked Shannon for a price estimate that she has on file for painting the parsonage windows and trim. Council was also informed that Garrett has completed the installation of the new breaker box in the parsonage, and that project is nearing completion with the exception of a few loose ends that are being addressed.
4. Council approved a recommendation from the **Christian Ed Committee** for a Doscher/Fellers Scholarship for Haleigh Gamble. Haleigh plans to attend Charleston Southern University in the fall, pursuing a degree in Social Studies Education. She will be using the funds to help with paying for books and enrollment fees.
5. Council approved a recommendation from the **Worship and Music Committee** to cater the meal for our Homecoming Sunday on September 19 and to fund that meal from the Thrivent Choice Dollars account.
6. Amy reported that members of the Good Shepherd **WELCA**, and friends, are planning to begin painting the Pastor’s office on Saturday, July 24.
7. Amy informed the Council that the Congregational Vitality Survey (CVS) is near completion and she will be sending those to Baylor University for processing. Once the results are available, Bishop Ginny Aebischer and Pastor Rick Carter will schedule a meeting with the

entire congregation to discuss those results. Amy also reported that the **Call Committee** is meeting regularly to work on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). Some of the data from the Congregational Site Survey will be incorporated into the Ministry Site Profile once the CVS results are available. The Ministry Site Profile will be presented to the congregation, and will be made available to perspective candidates for pastor of Good Shepherd.

The next Council meeting will be on Sunday, August 15, following worship.
