From the Pastor:

These days there is so much emphasis on political correctness. We're not supposed to say Merry Christmas, but rather Happy Holidays to be respectful of those who may not be Christian. I find it all a bit over the top. The very word "holiday" derives from the notion of "holy day"! And in our modern culture many people celebrate Christmas as a secular holiday----it's all about the gift giving (or getting) without a thought to the greatest gift the world has received. I don't want to be "grinchy" this season, but I do want to encourage making sure the "holy" is in our holiday celebrations.

At Good Shepherd we have a number of wonderful traditions for the month of December. First, the blue vestments announce the Advent season of hope and expectation. Each of the four weeks of Advent we hear the prayers to "stir up in us" anticipation of the God who has come, continues to come to us, and has promised to come at the end of time. This year we're inviting different folks from the congregation to participate in lighting the Advent wreath each week. We decorate the church with the Lommen tree, wreaths, poinsettias, and even place a tree in the portico to announce the festive season. The children will be doing their annual pageant and a special meal is planned for the congregation. It all culminates with Christmas Eve services at 7pm on December 24th.

But Christmas doesn't end on December 25th. The tradition is the 12 days of Christmas, and while stores may close everything out within a few days, we'll have our traditional carol service on Sunday, December 26th and the second Sunday of Christmas on January 2nd. Certainly some of you will travel over these holidays, but many of you will have family and friends visiting here. We'll be delighted to welcome them into the festivities whenever possible.

One more remembrance during this Advent and Christmas season. Our bishop and staff will have our Ministry Site Profile, praying over our call and looking for the right person to be our next pastor. Keep them in prayer these days. Because our search is for a part time person, that is different than many of the requests they get. Hold them and your church in prayer, so that the right person will emerge in God's time. Having served as your interim pastor for over 2 years now, I know that whoever comes to Good Shepherd will be blessed to receive this call.

October Council meeting notes: 11-14-2021

The November meeting of the church Council was opened with devotions by Kevin.

- ❖ Following the review of the financial reports for October and Year-to-Date, the Council approved sending one additional monthly gift of \$930 to the SC Synod for Ministry Support for 2021 in response to the generous year of giving we have had and in thanks for the help the staff of the SC Synod have given us this year.
- ❖ Amy presented reports from the Christian Education Committee, WELCA and the Worship and Music Committee. She also reported that the Council Executive Committee will be meeting with Pastor Craig following Thanksgiving to conduct his annual review.
- ❖ Doug Lindstrom updated the Council on activities of the Lutheran Men and Social Ministry/Food Pantry. Council approved donating \$300 from the Social Ministry account to St. Anthony's Catholic Church to help with the cost of the Thanksgiving meal they are providing to the needy of the community.
- ❖ Kevin gave a Call Process update to the Council. The Ministry Site Profile has been submitted to Bishop Aebischer and Amy and Kevin have responded to several questions from Bishop Aebischer after she reviewed the MSP.
- ❖ Council approved the purchase of three additional church directional signs. One sign will replace the one on Highway 17A south of town that has been destroyed over time by the grass mowers. The other two will be kept for future replacement needs. We have four signs within the city limits that were approved by the City several years ago. With the replacement of the damaged sign, all four of the approved signs will be intact within the city limits. A generous gift from a member of the congregation will cover the cost of the signs.
- ❖ The Council approved the change in designated offerings for December from Social Ministry to Lutheroad 2022. Because there are currently ample funds available for our Food Pantry and Social Ministry program, the Council approved the emphasis of Lutheroad for the month of December.
- ❖ In final business, the Council decided to utilize the U.S. Mail for distribution of our Council ballots again this year, similar to 2020. The balloting process will begin on Sunday, November 21.

There being no other business, the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
