## From Your Interim Pastor :

One of the unique differences of living in the low country after all my years in Minnesota is the coming of spring. Up north the Lenten season was all in winter, with maybe the earliest hints of spring if Easter was in late April. Here, while the Lenten season emphasizes a time of austerity and contemplation, it seems like nature around us is already bursting forth in celebration. Okay, so this year spring has been a little slow, but I have no doubt that by the time you read this the redbuds will be in bloom and the lorapetalums will be popping out. The contrast doesn't end there. In Minnesota spring often seemed like a 2-4-week season, whereas we get a robust 3 months or more of this glorious season.

With the coming of spring this year we have hope for the return of a more normal life. My wife and I have been fortunate to have received both doses of the Pfizer vaccine with the only side affect being a slightly sore arm. Right now, the availability of the vaccines is limited, but that will likely change dramatically within the next month or two. As a congregation we are making plans for summer camps and Lutherroad. We expect to be able to do more and more safely as vaccinations accelerate and the prevalence of the virus diminishes. While maintaining vigilance, I encourage all of you to begin to anticipate what we can be planning.

As we continue through the Lenten season, I invite you to continue to participate in both Sunday and Thursday opportunities to revisit our Lutheran catechism. These are fundamentals of our faith which help sustain us, particularly in times of trouble. Being able to recite some of these from memory is an asset. And understanding more of the background makes our words and rituals more meaningful. Toward the end of the Small Catechism Luther has offered us morning, evening, and table prayers. I'd encourage you to try using these (or something similar) to frame your day and mealtimes in God's care. The pandemic has no

doubt brought us some bad habits----but here's a chance to develop a new, life-giving practice for each day.

Finally, don't let your guard down now. We've come so far and there's light ahead. Continue to care for yourself and others. Stay in touch with family, friends, and your church community. Stay safe and we'll see you soon.

## February Council meeting notes : 2-21-2021

Kevin opened the meeting with devotionals.

1. Carl Lindstrom, Property Committee chair, reported that the Property Committee is seeking bids to replace the HVAC units in the sanctuary. Those bids are due March 6. He also reported that Dean Brinson has made much needed repairs to the accordion door in the Fellowship Hall. Carl is also organizing a walk-through of the Pastor's Office and the Parsonage to develop a list of items that need to be addressed.
2. Council approved the parsonage back yard oak tree removal cost be taken from the Maintenance Savings Account using some of the remaining funds from the parsonage roof replacement.
3. Pastor Craig reported on plans for Lenten services and the upcoming Worship and Music Committee meeting to discuss Holy Week and Easter services.
4. Amy reported on the Executive Committee meeting, the Christian Education committee meeting, the restart of the Wonderful Wednesday program, Lutheroad Day camp plans for this summer, upcoming Camp and Education Scholarships, the WELCA Spaghetti dinner and the church Social Ministry/Food Pantry program. Amy also briefly discussed the 2020 congregational summary report to the ELCA.
5. Council approved the Christian Education Committee motion on the cost of Lutheroad Day Camp for campers and the amount of Education Scholarships for the Fall semester. These funds come from the Doscher and Fellers Scholarship Fund.
6. Council approved the purchase of a laptop computer for Zoom worship, Confirmation class and Wonderful Wednesday. The computer will be purchased using Thrivent Choice Dollars.
7. Council appointed a subcommittee to develop written guidelines for our Social Ministry program and the newly established Lommen Love Fund. Council will review those guidelines next month. The subcommittee members are made up of Amy, Shannon and Kevin.
8. Kevin made Council aware of problems with the church organ that is being addressed by our representative from Fox Music.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Craig.

## Financial Corner

At the congregational meeting on Sunday, February 7, the “in-person” and “Zoom” members voted to adopt the new **2021 Spending Plan for Ministry**. The 2021 Plan is 2.8% more than the 2020 Plan, which equates to an increase of \$44 per week needed. The new Plan is based on assumptions that we will return to a more “normal” ministry in 2021 as the virus is brought under control. It is also based on our present model of ministering with our Interim Pastor. As it was so well pointed out by Council member Dean Brinson during the meeting, if we reach the point during the year that we are ready to call a Pastor for Good Shepherd, we will revise and vote on another Spending Plan for the remainder of the year.


