

From Your Interim Pastor :

This year Thanksgiving came as early as it possibly can and we will have four full weeks of Advent, with Christmas Day falling on a Sunday as well. That may mean things such as if you have a live Christmas tree, you may want to wait a week or so before you put it up. In these warm South Carolina winters those trees dry out pretty rapidly anyway. Georgia and I face a different dilemma because we are traveling to South Africa on December 28th. Our community requires that all external decorations be down shortly after New Year's so we're probably going to be a bit minimalist for our yard this year. We may, however, set a record for the dustiest Christmas tree as I don't think we'll want to take it down the day or two after Christmas.

Years ago, before we had children I remember hopping in the car after church on Christmas Eve to make the 12-hour drive to see our families in Ohio. Our neighbors thought we were really weird taking down our live tree on Christmas Eve. I know many of you still make all kinds of adjustments to gather together with family. For those of you who get to host family and friends, know that all are welcome at the various services and events at Good Shepherd.

Advent is always a special time of anticipation, but this year we have a special reason to be hopeful. Beginning on the first Sunday of Advent, Bishop Aebischer is coming to Good Shepherd in the afternoon to meet with the church councils from Good Shepherd and the Ehrhardt congregations to explore a possible partnership arrangement that would lead to sharing a full-time pastor. There are always challenges in trying to make this kind of partnership. Each church has been accustomed to having their own pastor with all the conveniences that provides. But we also know that the economics of this time makes it unrealistic for any of these churches to maintain a pastor on their own. Partnerships are a fairly new thing in South Carolina, but in the Dakotas and Minnesota where I served 36 years, such arrangements were very common and usually worked well. Each partner church needs to be flexible and understand that compromises are essential. We're just at the start of exploring if this can work to serve all the parties well, but I encourage your prayers for this process as we explore this new venture.

Finally, in this season of giving I'd like to thank all of the members and friends of Good Shepherd for your kindness, generosity, and support over this past year. None of us thought back in November of 2019 that we would be together in this interim time for this long. While we've settled into a routine, we want to remember that God has a new chapter of mission for Good Shepherd that will happen in God's good time. Advent is a time to dream and anticipate.

- Council has gratefully accepted an offer from Ms. Maria Rodriguez to continue our cleaning and janitorial program for the fellowship hall and church following the death of Mr. Glen Williams.
- Council approved the ballot for the 2023-2025 Council election and plans to begin that process on Sunday, November 20, and continue into December.

There being no further business, Amy closed the meeting with prayer.
