From the Pastor:

Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your toil is not in vain in the Lord. (1 Corinthians 15:58)

These past few weeks I've thought a lot about how people are becoming tired and frustrated at the persistence of the Covid 19 virus. We've been living with nearly 2 years of curtailed travel, altered routines, taking extra care for everything we do. Masks have become a way of public life, though I don't know anyone who really likes wearing one. Hearing someone cough in public used to be no big deal, but now we cower in fear at the prospect that this is the time I'll get infected. And, of course, we're all tired of the public debates over what really works. In our saner moments we know that science is always evolving and as we learn more, our ideas change. But it seems like this virus is always 2 steps ahead of our best efforts.

We look for someone to blame, whether it's the Chinese or the government, or immigrants. Something must have caused this----and, of course, it's not our fault! But all of that is irrelevant----and maybe even at this point at least some of this actually is our fault! Too few of us have been vaccinated. Human nature is such that even the most careful among us periodically let's down our guard. Early in January my wife and I were on a 5 day cruise. Everyone had to be vaccinated and all were tested prior to boarding. We were supposed to wear masks in all public spaces except when actively eating or drinking. Given those rules, most of the time we felt safer than being anywhere on land. But one evening we went to a show and saw that almost everyone who had a drink simply left their mask off. Before long we left the show.

A popular American English proverb, "when the going gets tough, the tough get going" means "when the situation becomes difficult, strong people are able to step up and handle it"(attributed to both John F. Kennedy's father and the American coach Knute Rockne). Well, my version of that is that when the going gets tough, people of faith step up. Steadfastness is one of the marks of a Christian. That same determination that led Christ to the cross in order to accomplish our salvation is in our DNA. Waiting out a 2 year pandemic is nothing when our ancestors wandered 40 years in the wilderness waiting for God's promise of a new land to be fulfilled for their children. For me personally as a baby boomer, I observed my parents' generation laboring long hours to send their children to college and set up a better life for us. While many today have a very shortsighted view of life, we are in it for the long haul. We will get on the other side of this pandemic. We will emerge as a church from this extended interim/transitional time to a stronger future ahead. Our faith gives us a living hope that will carry us through.

For whatever difficulties we had these past few years, we still need a calculator to count our blessings. So, do not lose faith. Let's live each day with steadfastness and confidence. God is with us and we are here for each other, looking ahead to a brighter day.


Sunshine News:

January Council meeting notes: 1-9-2022

The meeting was opened with devotions and prayer by Amy, who then welcomed our 2022-2024 Council members, Bob, Natalie and Kathie.

- ❖ Pastor Craig gave his report and Kevin presented the financial reports for December and for 2021.
- Amy brought reports from the Executive Committee, Christian Education and WELCA. Jon reported on the Lutheran Men and Shannon spoke about the Parsonage Paint project.
- ❖ Council approved raising the registration fee for Lutheroad participants from \$60 to \$65 for this summer. About 25% of the camp is covered by camper registration. The remainder is covered by donations from the congregation.
- ❖ Council also approved that the scholarships for college students and campers attending one of the NovusWay outdoor camps for the summer would again be \$300 for this year. Both of these scholarships are provided by our Doscher/Fellers Scholarship Fund.
- ❖ Council spent a great deal of time on the 2022 Spending Plan for Ministry and approved a plan that will be presented to the congregation at our annual meeting following worship on January 30.
- ❖ The Executive Committee and Pastor Craig met following the Council meeting to discuss Pastor Craig's annual review.

Your Council officers for 2022 are Amy Rusnak; chair, Dean

Brinson; vice chair, and Jon Carpenter; secretary. Kevin Wicker will be our Treasurer and our Recording Secretary is Doug Brinson.

Financial Corner

As I mentioned last month, at their January meeting, Council discussed funding the parsonage repairs. We have a line item in the Spending Plan for **routine maintenance** around the property. This includes things like pest control contracts, piano tuning, lights, pipes, wires, etc. We also have a small Maintenance Fund savings account that won't go far in repairing the parsonage. And, we have money from the General Fund collection last year that Council has set up in an "Operating Reserve Fund" for future expenses. And finally, we have some funds that have been given and designated for "parsonage repair." For large items we'll have to use the **Operating Reserve Fund** or the **Wallace** Fund. For smaller items we can draw from the Maintenance Fund savings account or the designated Parsonage Repair gifts. So, if you would like to help with funding the parsonage repairs you can either designate your gifts for "parsonage repair" or "maintenance fund." "Parsonage Repair" gifts will only be used for the parsonage, whereas "Maintenance Fund" gifts can be used for maintenance expenses of any kind of our property. When we have an idea of the total cost of the parsonage repairs, we'll communicate that to everyone.


By the time you read this article, we will probably already have voted on the **2022 Spending Plan** as proposed by Council. I'll have more on that in the March newsletter.
