

### From the Pastor :

As another challenging year has come to a close, the good people of this congregation have got to be wondering when we're going to catch a break. 2019 saw a difficult pastoral transition. 2020 had barely begun when Covid hit. We canceled services for a while, gradually went online, met for several months outdoors, and finally in November went indoors with all kinds of precautions in place. 2021 held out promise as vaccines rolled out and we seemed to inch our way toward a more normal congregational life. Yet Covid has persisted, and as we enter 2022, it's with a dark cloud of yet another mutation of the virus threatening.

This is not unlike what people have experienced in previous generations. We know from history that previous plagues wiped out masses of people in Europe in the middle ages. An ancient Israelites, God's chosen people lived through some glory years, but also centuries of war, conquest, and even exile. More recently our parents and grandparents survived two world wars and a devastating depression. Our history is full of times of challenge and years when darkness seemed far more prevalent than light.

The story of our faith is the story of hope. For long years the people waited for a Messiah. With the coming of Jesus many thought our years of struggle were over. But the last 2000 years has us continuing to wonder when-----when will God complete what was begun in Christ's redemption of the world.

I often tell people that I'm in sales, not management. We are not privy to what God is up to. What I do know is that just as God came into the world in a small back alley in Bethlehem, God continues to come to us in hidden and surprising ways. I don't our community today. What I do know is that we are being invited to live in faith, just as Mary and Joseph trusted God's word eons ago. The scriptures tell us in Hebrews 11: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." The passage goes on to talk about the faith of many past leaders. Hebrews was written to the first generations of Christians that expected Christ's return any day. It was encouragement to stay steadfast in their faith.

And the same could be said to us today. Lots of folks smarter than me are speculating when Covid will end----or at least become endemic. The divisiveness of our political climate seems to still have a pretty strong head of steam, so I'm not particularly hopeful there. For Good Shepherd, our bishop is looking for that next pastor to call, but she's challenged to find any candidates for part time ministry right now. So, like in many past times, we could focus on the darkness----the reasons to despair. But we walk by faith. And I invite you to keep lighting that one candle rather than cursing the darkness. Together we will be light to each other and to our world, in Jesus' name.

### **December Council meeting notes :** 12-12-2021

Doug Lindstrom opened with devotions. Following devotions, Amy expressed our thanks to Doug for serving the past six years on Council.

- After review of the financial report, Council approved transferring money from the Checking Account to the Wallace Fund to completely "repay" the fund of all money borrowed for past operating expenses and projects at the church.
- At their January meeting, Council will approve the 2022 Spending Plan for Ministry to be taken to the congregation for consideration at our annual Congregational Meeting on January 30 following worship.
- Council members heard Pastor Craig's report as well as reports from Worship and Music, WELCA, Christian Education from Amy. Amy also notified members of the date of the Executive Board meeting to prepare Pastor Craig's annual review.
- Doug Lindstrom reported that the last Food Pantry for 2021 will be on Tuesday, December 21, and we plan to spend the complete grant from Community Foundation of the Lowcountryby the end of 2021.
- Amy reported that the church directional signs have been purchased and the damaged sign replaced. She expressed thanks to Garrett Brinson for providing the funds for those signs.
- Kevin showed the Council members the fire blankets that have been gifted to the church by John and Linda Gilgen. These blankets will be placed at the locations of the three fire extinguishers in the sanctuary and fellowship hall to be used in conjunction with the extinguishers in case of a small fire.
- Council approved Mrs. Faye Rister to post an ad in the local paper for our Christmas Eve Candlelight Service.
- Council approved the "soup pot" be placed in the narthex for those who would like to donate to Lutheran Disaster Response for tornado relief in Kentucky.

# **Financial Corner**

Although we won't see the year-end numbers until next month, we have completed 2021 within our Spending Plan for Ministry, gave an additional gift to the SC Synod for Mission Support, and we've begun planning for 2022.

At their December meeting, the Council approved \$12,746 to be transferred from the Checking Account to the **Wallace Fund** to completely "repay" money to the Wallace Fund that has been used for operating expenses and capital projects since its inception in 2012. This means that the Wallace Fund has been fully restored and is available for use as needed in the future. This is only possible through your generous donations over the past two years.


