From Your Interim Pastor :

Independence Day is the genuine American patriotic holiday. In recent years many of our Christian communities have increasingly tried to tie Christian and patriotic themes together. How often have you heard the USA described as a “Christian Nation”? While historically we have been a religious nation, our founding fathers were “Deists” rather than Christian. There is no question that they saw faith as a pillar of American society. But having come from England and other parts of Europe to escape religious persecution, the founders were not about to tie America to any specific faith tradition. Even the words “under God” were not added to the Pledge of Allegiance until 1954.

Recently many church groups have tried to claim identification with American patriotism. Many politicians have seized on the “opportunity” to gain greater popularity by connecting with these faith groups, turning them into formidable voting blocks---and, at the same time casting their opponents as unbelieving clods. The most blatant has been by the far right GOP, using the language of Christian Nationalism (and not so subtly, leaning heavily toward WHITE Christian Nationalism). Nothing could be further from what the founding fathers intended.

Recently I saw an editorial cartoon that had 3 men talking. The first man said he was really upset at all the immigrants coming into the USA and all the accommodations we were being forced to make. The second man (also white) said we should send all the foreigners back where they came from. The third man, a Native American, asked the other two where they were from!

America was built as the land of the free and the home of the brave. Many who have come to this country have done so to

escape all manner of religious, ethnic, and political persecution. To be free requires that we respect the rights and opportunities of one another. It takes a certain level of maturity and bravery to confront the immense diversity of our country and seek to live together as free people.

What would Jesus say about being a person of faith and patriotic? In Matthew 22:15-22 Jesus is asked about loyalty. The Pharisees who asked were trying to get Jesus into trouble. But Jesus responds, “Give to Caesar the things that are Caesar’s, and unto God the things that are God’s.” So we are citizens of a great nation, and it is appropriate for us to be supportive of our country. But we are also citizens of the Kingdom of God and loyalty is required there as well. To be honest, there will be times when we face real dilemmas. For example, those who were drafted for the military but objected to carrying a weapon faced difficult choices. One never knows when you’ll be confronted with a conflict of loyalties.

At Good Shepherd there are two flags in front of the church. They are of equal height. The American flag reminds us of the blessings of our religious freedom. On the other side of the church is the Christian flag, symbolic of our loyalty to God. Thankfully they are mainly seen as compatible and certainly important enough to be displayed in the front of the church. They remind us of our dual loyalties to God and country.

Call Committee Update :



Choir is on break and will return in September.


