### From the Pastor :

Summer has come to the Lowcountry, and with it the heat, humidity, and the popup showers. Fortunately, our church is air conditioned and free of sand gnats so whenever you're in town, we hope you'll join us. We are gradually returning to our normal pre-pandemic worship while still taking whatever precautions are indicated by local health officials. The first Sunday in June is Pentecost, the birthday of the Christian church. We encourage you to wear red that day. We will be honoring our graduates and having a congregational meal after church. Come and enjoy!

In mid-June the South Carolina Synod will meet in Assembly in Charleston. Kevin and Diane Wicker will join me in representing Good Shepherd as we learn about the work of the larger church and celebrate the strength of our combined ministry in this state.

What else is happening this summer? Painting of the parsonage, both outside and inside, has been completed except for a few finishing touches. Some carpentry work is currently underway which will be followed by carpet cleaning and several new appliances. Later this summer we'll invite everyone for a congregational walk-through. I've not heard yet, but we may be invited to contribute minor touches such as new light fixtures or ceiling fans. It has been quite a while since there has been a significant refurbishment of the parsonage and we're eager to see the results.

Behind the scenes, your council and call committee continue to explore options for our next pastor. Finding a part time person who will also be the right person for this call is a major challenge, but we know that it will happen in God's good time. Please keep

your leaders in your prayers and pray that God will lead that right person to us. In the meantime, our ministry continues. The food pantry feeds some 50+ families every two weeks. Recently several Good Shepherd men have worked on the Vendricks' access ramp. The men's group held a wonderful BBQ supper. And while Wonderful Wednesdays is over until fall, our summer camp week will be happening July 18-22. Watch for the ways you'll be able to help with that week.

I hope to see you often in worship this summer. I'll be here for much of the summer and you'll also enjoy a few visiting pastors when I'm at St. John's in Beaufort. Enjoy each day as a gift from God and an opportunity to be a blessing to others.

### Property Committee update – May newsletter

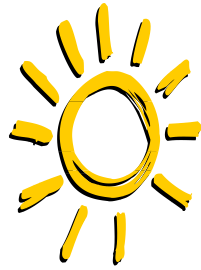
The painting of the parsonage is complete with the exception of areas in the den and kitchen where work is yet to be done. Our Carpentry Contractor, Adam Moore, and his crew has begun work in the den and kitchen with a scope that ranges from floor support and floor covering to cabinet modifications and new counter tops. The kitchen work will be topped off with the addition of new appliances. Once the work in the kitchen and den is finished, we will begin putting things back together in the parsonage. Thus far, we have spent, or have committed to, approximately \$6,500 for the parsonage project. If you'd like to support the parsonage repair project, you can do so by giving to the "Maintenance Fund."

In other property news, at their May meeting, church Council approved the replacement of the damaged Luther Rose in the breezeway. The original rose was placed in the breezeway by Mrs. Marjorie Reser and Ms. Linda Hayes when the new sanctuary was built in 2001. The new rose will be installed soon.



## Sunshine News :

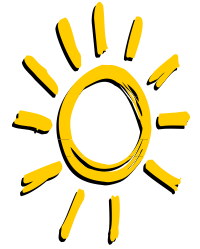

We began the year with the normal weak month of January, rebounded with strong giving in February and March, and hit a bit of slump in April. However, May appears to be shaping up to be a strong month of giving. Through April, we have spent 30% of our **Spending Plan for Ministry**, our funds available in our Checking account are nearly exactly the same as last year at this time, and gifts have been almost \$2,300 more than our normal operating expenses.

As the weather gets hot, church treasurers across the land begin to think of the traditional "**Summer Slump in Giving.**" As you plan your busy summer activities, please remember that summer is also an active time at Good Shepherd and our expenses continue through these hot, dry days.
