

# From the Pastor :

For the first time in two years, I'm delighted to use most of my message to not talk about viruses. Yes, we still have some challenges but at the moment infection rates are trending down and our fears are subsiding. So, can we talk about the future of this church? Having survived a difficult and tumultuous time, we barely caught our breath before heading into what has now been two very challenging Covid years. For many, it's been quite a while since actually attending church in person. Wonderful as it has been to have Zoom and other media options, we've been missing the wealth of human contact, not just in worship, but in meals, activities, and just staying caught up with one another. I think we've learned that there's a place for church via the internet and I don't think that will end any time soon. But the down side is that we've become a bit lazy and lulled into thinking one option for worship is adequate to maintain the body of Christ.

I'll be honest-----I've missed many of you. Because I lead worship one Sunday a month in Beaufort, there are times I may not see you for weeks on end. One of the reasons I try to be hanging out well before worship is to be able to catch up with each of you----to hear progress reports and any prayer requests. And for those of you significantly homebound, I find one day per week to be in Walterboro in the office to be severely limiting. I'd like to do more-----but I've also got commitments to St. John's in Beaufort every week and I really need that portion of my life that is retirement. The energy level I had at age 30----or even 60 is not there anymore!

The future of Good Shepherd is fortunately way beyond my future. Recently the call committee had their first interview with a

potential part time candidate. For South Carolina, part time pastoring is a new phenomenon and finding candidates is a challenge. The council and call committee have also considered the options of a two-year intern (seminary student) or partnering with another congregation. Wisely your leadership has concluded that the previous pattern of having a full-time pastor is not reasonable, affordable, or necessary. It probably hasn't been realistically affordable for some time.

I'm confident we'll find the right leader for Good Shepherd in good time (and God's time). But the future of Good Shepherd is really in the hands of you, the people of this community of faith. As we emerge out of this pandemic, it's time to assume the kinds of roles and responsibilities that will make the future of Good Shepherd bright and hopeful. Being present as much as you can----offering yourself to take up a new task or two-----living into making this church community all that it can be-----that's all of our work. Together we will grow in faith, service, and Christian maturity. That's the future of Good Shepherd.


#### The Lutheran Men in Mission of Good Shepherd
