

November Council meeting notes: 11-12-2023

The meeting was opened with devotions and prayer by Amy.

- Council approved the minutes from the October meeting.
- Members then heard the financial report and the Pastor's report, as well as reports from LMM, WELCA, Social Ministry, and Property and Grounds.
- From **Property and Grounds**, Dean and Bob will be renewing the church sign at the corner of Jeffries and May Streets.
- From **Social Ministry**, Doug informed members that our Food Pantry is receiving proceeds from the Fish Fry that will fund the Pantry through the end of the year. He also reported that Good Shepherd is the recipient of a \$7,500 grant for 2024 from **Church of the Cross** in Bluffton!! That grant will provide funds for about half of the Food Pantry expenses for 2024.
- Council approved the purchase of a new **eternal candle** red globe to replace the current globe which has been damaged for some time. The new globe will be funded through the Memorial Fund.
- Council approved the **ballot** for electing Council members for 2024 through 2026.
- Council approved the new **Infectious Decease Guideline** for Good Shepherd to be implemented in the future if needed. Copies of the guideline are located in the narthex.
- Members reviewed the latest revision of the new Good Shepherd **pictorial directory** and expressed thanks to Natalie and Haleigh Gamble for collecting the photos. The directory will be available on the church website and in black and white hardcopy if requested.

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Financial Corner

Happy Fall from the Financial Corner. This year surely is coming to a close quickly. Just a few points to make from the Financial Corner.

First, we have great news for the **Food Pantry**! We received a grant for 2024 from **Church of the Cross** in Bluffton for \$7,500, which is approximately one half of our operating cost for the year. The men's fish fry resulted in \$1,500 for Social Ministry which will carry the Food Pantry through the remainder of 2023. And, during October we received a gift from **Bethel Presbyterian Church** to help with the Food Pantry. (If you know someone at Bethel, make sure you tell them Thanks! for this gift.)

Second, our giving in October was "slow" once again. While we are operating within our Ministry Plan for the year, we need to have a strong finish to the year to set ourselves up for the beginning of 2024. December is typically a strong month in many ways at Good Shepherd, including financially.

And finally, we have received many complements on the new **Audio** and **Streaming system** we installed during the summer. With the exception of the occasional "surprise," we are pretty consistent from week to week, both with the sound levels in the sanctuary and streaming on Facebook. To date, we have only put about \$500 back into the **Wallace Fund** for the system, with a balance owed of about \$19,000. We hope to continue to put this money back into the Wallace Fund so it will be available for future capital improvements at the church.

As always, if you have questions concerning the finances of Good Shepherd, please give me a call. And, I hope to see you in person or online for church.

Some of you know that a couple of months ago I assumed the responsibility for placing the Red Cross Blood Drive signs around town before each blood drive at Good Shepherd. I assumed the duties from Mr. Brian Cassidy who had assumed them from our own Arden Lommen. I would like to ask for any number of people to "adopt" a sing, or as many as 18 signs, to place at these locations on Saturday or Sunday, six times a year, before each blood drive, and to recover those signs on Monday night after 7:00 p.m. or Tuesday. If you have a suitable place, you could store your sign(s) until the next blood drive and then put them out, again. It's possible that next year we could secure additional funding and acquire more signs to place, but these are the ones we have for now.

Please note on Sunday or Monday where the signs are located and let me know if you would like to adopt any of these. If so, I'll let you recover your sign(s) on Tuesday and keep it for the next drive in January. Our current blood drive dates for 2024 are January 15, March 11, May 13, July 8, September 9, and November 11.
