From Your Interim Pastor:

I'm finding it rather humorous that we still label this article from the "interim" pastor. I've now been serving here longer than many of the so-called "regular" pastors over the years! But, yes, we are still in an interim, lengthy as it might be. Interim is defined as temporary----a time between two regular sessions. So, for example, a college interim is a short period between two semesters when students can do a unique and concentrated elective subject. One might say that Good Shepherd is having an extended interim transitioning from having a full-time pastor to when you will share that pastor with Ehrhardt. I'm particularly impressed by the resilience and commitment of so many of you to make this work. I think you've already proven that sharing a pastor will be a good thing for Good Shepherd.

As of mid-May the Ehrhardt churches are still working on their Ministry Site Profile. When that is complete the bishop will begin considering candidates for our shared call. In the meantime, we'll be preparing the call committee with interview training and preparing our questions.

Many consider June as the start of the summer slow-down, but that isn't the case here at church. On June 3rd the men have their annual barbeque feast. Don't forget to get your tickets! Of course, you'll want to honor all our men on Fathers' Day June 18th and we'll need plenty of volunteers for Lutheroad the week of June 26th. That Thursday there's an all-congregation cookout to celebrate the week. Watch for more details.

I also want to mention our South Carolina Synod Assembly June 8-10 in Columbia. Rob and Amy Rusnak will join me in representing Good Shepherd as voting members. As part of the Friday festivities, I'll be recognized for 50 years of service as an ordained pastor. I guess there aren't that many of us that make that milestone, and even fewer still in active service. Boy, has the time flown by! Assembly is the annual gathering of the 147 South Carolina ELCA congregations where we share mission stories and act on the business of the synod. It's always eye opening to see all the ways that we serve as church in our territory and beyond. Kevin Wicker will also be attending as a member of the synod nominating committee.

One final bit of trivia. Some of you may use the daily devotionals we distribute here at church. If you're looking for another option, our Lutheran Worship book includes a daily lectionary starting on page 1121 in the back of the book. Sometime when you're early for church or bored by a sermon (not mine, of course), check out all the interesting content in our worship book. It's way more than hymns, a great resource for our faith.

Social Ministry

Our **Social Ministry** program, which helps approximately 150 households per month with food, is in need of immediate support. Although we receive support from our congregation, our Lutheran Women, Bethel Presbyterian Church, the Elks Lodge, the Friends of the Colleton County Animal Shelter, and soon, the Eastern Star, we are within two months of exhausting our funds. The expected proceeds from the Lutheran Men's BBO will provide about two more months of operation. We are going to pursue a grant from the ELCA Domestic Hunger program, but if we are approved, that money would not be available until March 2024. You can support our Food Pantry by placing non-perishable food items in the grocery cart in the narthex, or by placing your gift in the offering plate designated for **Social Ministry.**

Sunshine News:

Applications for school scholarships are now available, along with the guidelines for the application. These scholarships are for those students in our congregation who are pursuing either an associate degree or a bachelor degree. Please see Diane Wicker for applications. 
Financial Corner

May Council meeting notes: 5-21-2023

The meeting was opened with devotions by Amy.

The April financial report, the Pastor's report, and the minutes from the last meeting were presented.

- Jon informed the Council that an executive committee meeting had been held during the month and a "Lommen Love Fund" project was approved.
- Reports were presented from Property and Grounds, Lutheran Men, WELCA, Social Ministry, Service Committee, and the Call Process Transition Team.
- Council approved the purchase and installation of a sound system for our sanctuary that will allow us to amplify the service, provide hearing assistance to those who need it, and "stream" our Sunday morning services without the cumbersome table and wires we have been using for the past two years. Because of the cost of the system, a congregational meeting will be held on Sunday, June 4, following worship for a vote. Council proposes funding the system by borrowing money from our Wallace Estate Fund.
- Council approved pursuing a grant from the ELCA Domestic Hunger program for our Food Pantry. Kevin will begin working on the Letter of Intent with help from other Council members.
- Council approved a recommendation from Worship and Music to "stand down" from our current Covid Guidelines. Council also agreed to work on a "Contagious Disease" guideline for future use per a recommendation from Worship and Music.

There being no other business, the meeting was closed with prayer.
