

## From Your Interim Pastor :

Two significant things are happening this March. The first, of course, is that we are into the Lenten season. Each Sunday we experience Jesus as he engages with various people from very different life journeys. In each case, our Lord offers a word of hope and opens new doors. May this season do the same for you. On Thursdays we'll be gathering for those delicious soup suppers followed by brief reflections on the theme "Worship Matters" along with parts of Holden Evening Prayer. We'll explore why we worship, how we encounter God's word, the role of sacraments in our life, the meaning of the worship space, and the connection of prayer with our everyday life. I hope you'll learn something, but also be inspired to appreciate worship more deeply.

The second big thing happening is our transition team is actively involved with the Ehrhardt parish in working out a partnership agreement for the sharing of a pastor. I was particularly encouraged at the first meeting on February 19<sup>th</sup>. All eight of the representatives (4 from Good Shepherd and 4 representing Mt. Pleasant and Memorial) seemed committed to trying to make this work. While it would be possible to feel sad that neither community can afford a full time pastor, we are choosing to see this as an opportunity for a positive future. Both communities have struggled for years with affording a pastor. But we all have wonderful churches with a core of deeply committed members. I know that Good Shepherd will benefit from a pastor who lives in this community and is able to become involved with the local activities in ways that I have not in my limited role.

How fast this all comes together remains to be seen. Once the transition team has its set of recommendations, each of the

councils and congregations will need to approve the partnership agreement. Only then will a call committee commence its work. So, it looks like I will be with you for a while longer. At Synod Assembly this June I will be celebrating my 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination. It doesn't seem possible that I graduated from seminary and was called to serve in St. Paul, Minnesota in 1973! There aren't a whole lot of us these days that make that longevity, and even fewer that are still active in ministry. I hope we'll be able to celebrate here at Good Shepherd as well. Until then, its full speed ahead as we worship and serve in Jesus' name.

### February Council meeting notes : 2-12-2023

Kevin opened the meeting with prayer.

- The minutes from the January meeting were presented by Jon. Jon also presented a report from Pastor Craig.
- Kevin presented the financial report for January as well as the proposed 2023 Spending Plan for Ministry. Following discussion, and some changes, Council approved the Spending Plan to be presented to the Congregation.
- Having accepted Marie Wilson's resignation from Council, members approved leaving that position open for the remainder of the year when it will be filled during the election of the 2024-2026 Council members.
- Council heard reports from Property and Grounds, Christian Education, Lutheran Men and Social Ministry. In the report from Worship and Music, Jon notified Council of a problem with the organ and Diane's plans to have the service technician on site to correct the problem.
- Jon reported that the Transition Team will be meeting with members from Ehrhardt Memorial and Mt. Pleasant on Sunday afternoon, February 19, to work on the transition plan for our partnership. Pastor Craig will also be at that meeting representing Good Shepherd. Once a transition plan is developed, it will go before the Council of all three congregations for approval and then will go before all three congregations for approval.

#### **Good Shepherd Lutheran Financial Funds**

The **General Fund** is used to pay for the Operating expenses of our ministry and the routine maintenance of our facilities. The General Fund is most often associated with our Spending Plan for Ministry for the year. The balance in the General Fund is the checking account balance, less any designated item held in the checking account. The current balance is reported each month in the newsletter as "Available in Checking". That value is currently \$30,000.

The **Doscher/Feller Scholarship Fund**, formerly known as the **Doscher and Fellers Education and Outdoor Ministry Fund**, was established by Mr. Ralph Doscher and Mr. Stanley Fellers for the purpose of supporting the spiritual and educational growth of the Good Shepherd members and associate members through institutions of higher education and Lutheran outdoor ministries. These funds are used for financial assistance of young people attending summer camp (Lutheridge, Lutherock, etc.) and to provide financial assistance for members attending institutions of higher education after high school. The balance in the Scholarship Fund is now \$6,438.

The **Maintenance Fund** is used for the routine annual maintenance of our property. Any money in the annual Spending Plan for Ministry that is not used for maintenance during the year is placed in the Maintenance Fund Savings Account for future use. The current balance in the Maintenance Fund is \$3,757.

The **Memorial Fund** is money set aside to purchase those items that are used in our worship setting. The current balance in the Memorial Fund is \$1,150.

The **Service Committee Fund** may be used to provide meals to bereaved families after the death of a loved one or hospitalized members when they return home. The current balance in the Service Committee Fund is \$477.

The **Sign Fund** was established at the request of the family of Sonny Roberts following his death. The fund is to be used to

purchase a new sign for the church along Jeffries Boulevard. The current balance in the fund is \$955.

The **Social Ministry** fund is used to help those in need in our community with food, utility bills, prescription medication, etc. The Social Ministry program includes the **Food Pantry program**. Approximately \$12,000 of assistance is managed through the Social Ministry Fund each year with support coming from members of Good Shepherd and throughout our community. The Social Ministry policy is available upon request. The current balance in the Social Ministry Fund is \$3,984.

The Lommen Love Fund was established in 2021 with a gift from the children of Arden and Mary Lommen in loving memory of their parents. The fund is used to aid and assist members and friends of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in time of need. The children of Arden and Mary Lommen are not opposed to the funds being used other areas that would honor the memory of Arden and Mary. The Lommen Love Fund policy is available upon request. The current balance in the Lommen Love Fund is \$7.980.

The **Wallace Fund** was established using a gift from the estate of Mrs. Margaret Wallace following her death. Mrs. Wallace left this gift as an unrestricted fund for use at the discretion of the Council. Although we have used the fund in past years to shore up the General Fund, the general consensus has been to use this fund for capital improvements of the facilities. Over the past five years, donor gifts have reestablished the original corpus of the Wallace Fund. The current balance in the Wallace Fund is now \$69,806.
