From Your Pastor:

Many of you have heard me preach and talk about the current shortage of pastors in the ELCA (and many other denominations). That concern is no longer just a distant issue. The South Carolina synod office reports that they have way more church vacancies than they have pastors looking to move. I had thought that after the pandemic years there would be a larger number of clergy eager for a new setting. I do know we've got very few seminary graduates, so the numbers coming into ministry is not matching the number retiring.

Last month the joint call committee determined they had a primary candidate to serve the Good Shepherd/Ehrhardt parishes---only to have that candidate withdraw, deciding it was not the right time for a move. That was disappointing news for all of us, and especially for those call committee members who had invested hours in the search process. We will carry on, knowing that the right person is out there and God's timing is always better than ours. But as the scriptures say, the harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few.

It's hard to believe that we're already into fall and coming up on the holiday season. Thanksgiving isn't until November 23rd, but I'm sure you're beginning to make plans with family and friends. Georgia and I will be headed up to see her 99-year-old father the later part of October so we'll be at Good Shepherd all of the next two months except for my monthly obligation to St. John's in Beaufort. While it would be nice to be with family for Christmas, we have done our time in snow country and they all know where we live!

Happy Fall from the Financial Corner. September proved to be a "soft" month of giving, but fortunately, it was also a month of routine expenses with no surprises. So, all worked out well in the financial corner.

During the first two Sundays in October, we collected a "Love Offering" of \$945 for seminary student Jace Martinez. Pastor Craig has sent that to Jace with a "Love" note from Good Shepherd.

You may notice in the Council Minutes that we have exhausted all of our funds for the Social Ministry/Food Pantry program for 2023. At their October meeting, Council voted to provide funding from our Thrivent Choice Dollars account to pay for the groceries for the first Tuesday in November. Hopefully, a generous turnout for the Lutheran Men's Fish Fry on November 4 will provide funding for the Food Pantry for the three remaining Tuesdays in 2023. The average cost of operating the Food Pantry is about \$1,200 per month.

October Council meeting notes: 10-08-2023

The meeting was opened with devotions and prayer by Natalie.

- Council approved the minutes from the September meeting and an Executive Committee meeting.
- Members then heard the Financial report, and reports from LMM, WELCA, Social Ministry, Property and Grounds, and, the Call Committee.
- From **Property and Grounds**, the Council discussed possible options for repair of a motorized handicap scooter that has been donated to the church. They also discussed other options to repairing the scooter if repairs are cost prohibitive.
- From Social Ministry, Doug and Kevin informed members that our Social Ministry/Food Pantry is out of funds for this year. Council approved the use of Thrivent Choice **Dollars** to fund the Food Pantry the first Tuesday of November, with hopes that proceeds from the **Lutheran** Men's Fish Fry will fund the Food Pantry for the remainder of the year. Kevin also notified members that an application for a 2024 grant has been submitted and news on that grant should be available by the end of October.
- Amy reported that the perspective "Primary Candidate" for our next pastor has respectfully withdrawn her name from the process. The Call Committee will await another name, or names, of possible candidates from Bishop Ginny.
- Amy also reported that Lutheran Disaster Response Carolinas is seeking supporting congregations to provide "team shelters" and "comfort spots" for teams responding to natural disasters. Council approved Amy to have a representative from LDRC speak to Council in the near

There being no further business, the meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.
