

From Your Pastor :

Most of you know that I've been the president of a timeshare association out in the Colorado mountains for more than 10 years now. I'm part of a really great board that is charged with stewardship of these condos----making sure they are kept up to date and remain a good value for our owners. Recently I've thought about how we are part of a long line of people who have assumed leadership and helped steward these properties for more than 40 years. Some were better at the task than others. A few even took advantage of their position to profit themselves. But we are charged with a responsibility to exercise as best we can, leaving these properties for those who will come after us.

It's the same for us as a church. Whether pastor or council members, other leaders, or simply attendees. We are part of a mission that started at Good Shepherd some 83 years ago. Winfield Simons is our one member who may have attended here back in those days (in the arms of his mother). What we do in these days builds on the rich history of those who began this enterprise back in 1940. If you've not taken time recently to read the history of Good Shepherd, it's a good read. Of particular note is all the early challenges for that young church and how they built this community during the post-depression and World War 2 years.

These past few years we've endured a difficult season with a downturn in membership, a pandemic, and four years of ministry without a regular pastor. As a part time, non-resident interim pastor, I've been impressed with how you have assumed your roles as stewards of this ministry and given it renewed life. It's been a privilege to walk with you, to preach the gospel, teach, and nurture friendships in this place. As I write this, we eagerly anticipate that a new chapter for Good Shepherd in partnership with the Ehrhardt churches is on the horizon.

Mindful of the future, your church council has authorized a special offering in support of an upcoming seminary student. In August we got to meet seminary student Jace Martinez. He was warmly received, preached his very first sermon here, and inspired several members to suggest that we provide some support for Jace and his wife, Julia. This is a great thing to do. When I went through seminary long ago, my home congregation provided generous support so that I could enter ministry with minimal debt. On October 1 and 8, the first two Sundays in October you are all invited to contribute toward a special offering toward Jace's education. I'd love to see this become an annual time of supporting our future pastors! God's mission lives on beyond us.

<u>Did you Know :</u> The Nina and Pinta were not the actual names of two of Columbus' three ships.

In 15th-century Spain, ships were traditionally named after saints. Salty sailors, however, bestowed less-than-sacred nicknames upon their vessels. Mariners dubbed one of the three ships on Columbus's 1492 voyage the Pinta, Spanish for "the painted one" or "prostitute." The Santa Clara, meanwhile, was nicknamed the Nina in honor of its owner, Juan Nino. Although the Santa Maria is called by its official name, its nickname was La Gallega, after the province of Galicia in which it was built.
