From Your Pastor :

What kind of questions should we ask? In August the joint call committee for Ehrhardt/Good Shepherd trained and then began interviewing their first candidates from the synod. In this age of electronic communications, the first interviews are being held via Zoom. While it's not perfect, this allows the team to have a first conversation without the challenges of finding a time and money to bring candidates here. From there, they'll decide along with their candidates whether they want to have deeper conversations and an onsite meeting, or if other names are needed from the synod.

One of the things we discussed in our training was that this is a time of mutual discernment. The pastor has already felt God's leading to be open to a new call, but is this the right setting that matches his/her gifts-----and there's always a bit of magic (God's Spirit) leading in discerning what this next chapter should be. The same is true for the congregations. Good Shepherd and Ehrhardt are looking for God's leading into this new partnership and new phases of congregational life.

There are some ground rules we all need to follow. This is a confidential process. Serving another congregation, a pastor doesn't want that current parish to know too soon that they might be leaving. It's a small world, so we want to keep those names strictly private to the call committee until such time as they might identify a primary candidate. Likewise, it is not appropriate for any of us to pressure one of our team members to reveal insider information. Pray for your team members and thank them for their dedicated work----but respect their task, confident that they are doing their best to envision the future for this church.

This is an exciting time. Good Shepherd has come a long way since I arrived as interim in November 2019. We had a lengthy period of recovery, and before that was very far along, we had Covid. While we wouldn't want to relive that kind of plague, Covid caused us to become flexible and creative in how we would be church. Making services available online became a new thing. For a time, we worshiped outside----remember those men setting up large fans as the summer heat bore down? Eventually we moved back inside, but shortening the service, seating at a distance, taking temperatures, and for a while, not even singing! Gradually more people came back to worship and activities returned to our new normal. We've had confirmations, a wedding, funerals, baptisms, children and youth events, congregational celebrations. We have recaptured our calling as a church community.

The main question that remains to be asked is how will Good Shepherd move out into mission with a new, shared full time pastor. It's not a question for today, yet. But it is one that will come into focus as you enter into a new chapter and partnership. After a nearly four-year interim, you're ready! As that great hymn says, "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim!"


