

**From The Pastor :** (A look at the past - these are excerpts taken from the first newsletter article from Pastor Craig – I mostly wanted to reflect on the third paragraph)

"Thank you all for the warm welcome you have given me as I begin my interim time at Good Shepherd. Let me share a little of who I am. .....

Your council has decided that they would like me to be with you normally as much as 3 Sundays plus special services, as well as one day per week. Initially that day will vary each week as I try to become acquainted with people and activities here. In December I'll be here on Sundays 1,15, 22, and Christmas Eve. On weekdays I will try to visit the home bound and take in meetings or activities. I would also like to hear as many of your stories as possible. This will be a work in progress, but your council and I want to be sure you have access to pastoral service during this interim time. By February I'd like to settle on a regular day that I will be in Walterboro.

It used to be that the time between pastors was a time to save up some money and take a break from mission. That's old thinking. Interim is a time to reassess where you have come from, to celebrate the gifts of this congregation, and revision the future. I'm pleased to be able to join with you and help guide these important tasks as Good Shepherd continues in mission.

There will not be a Lutheroad Day Camp this year because of price increases from NovusWay. The committee will revisit this in 2025. The committee also briefly discussed the possibility of offering an education program on Sunday mornings in the fall. It was decided to survey the congregation for interest. The committee will work on a survey at the next meeting. Christian Education committee will meet next on Saturday, March 2, 2024, at 10:00 am.



#### **Property Report :** (01-20-2024)

We have two immediate needs facing the congregation in regards to our property. First, on Sunday, February 4, following worship, the congregation will vote on replacing the two heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) units in the Fellowship Hall. The compressor on one of the units failed near the end of 2023 and has not been replaced. These units are over 35 years old and are very inefficient by today's standards. We have secured a quote of \$15,100 to replace both units and Council is bringing that recommendation to the congregation for a vote.

Also, the sanctuary roof sustained some damage during the storm on January 9. We have contacted our insurance company and are awaiting a visit from the adjuster for an inspection and to discuss our options.

And finally, last, but certainly not least, "thank you" to all who helped repair and restore the church sign at the corner of Jefferies and May Streets. It looks great!

### January Council meeting notes : 01-14-2024

Cheryl opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

- The Council members then welcomed our new members Marylyn, Rusty and Doug B.
- The following members were elected to positions of leadership for 2024; Doug Lindstrom (Chair), Bob Ferris (Vice Chair), Natalie Gamble (Secretary), Jon Carpenter (Financial Secretary) and Kevin Wicker (Treasurer). And, Cheryl Clayton was appointed by Council to send notes acknowledging financial gifts to the church, a responsibility that Shannon Guess has generously done since the passing of Mrs. Eleanore Gloeckler.
- Members reviewed the 2023 financial spreadsheet and then approved the 2024 Spending Plan for Ministry which will be presented to the congregation for vote on Sunday, February 4, following worship. Council also approved the replacement of both of the Heating and Air Conditioning units in the Fellowship Hall. This will also be taken to the congregation for vote on February 4.
- While discussing financial matters, members approved a portion of the 2023 General Fund offering be moved to the Wallace Fund to pay back some of the cost of the new Sound System. They also approved a donation to a non-profit organization as a gift for Pastor Craig upon his retirement. Council then approved the new rate of reimbursement for our supply pastors as recommended by the SC Synod.
- Council approved increasing the scholarships for higher education students to \$400 per year and for young people attending summer camp at Lutheridge, Lutherock, Luthersprings, or Luther Ranch to \$500. These funds are available from the Doscher-Fellers Scholarship Fund.
- In a discussion regarding usher responsibilities, Council approved that one of the ushers will act as the second communion assistant if an acolyte is not available on communion Sundays.
- In a final matter of business, members decided they will continue to meet following worship on the second Sunday


of each month after our worship time moves to 11:00 a.m. in February.
