From The Pastor: (Farewell - the last sermon from Pastor Craig)

Are you possessed? Do you sometimes wonder if some of the folks you see on the news might be possessed? The whole of the New Testament has lots of references to demon possession and evil spirits. We modern folks are far less likely to think about such things----though we occasionally hear about exorcisms, and certainly movies seem rather fascinated with the mystical world and occult. I'm not sure we know exactly what these "demons" (or in some cases what the Bible refers to as Unclean Spirits) ----and yet scripture may have a clearer way of describing these phenomena than we do.

We've heard and seen people who have acted crazy! I attribute much of the verbal and physical violence perpetrated these days in society to the pervasive forces of evil in the world. It's more than just mental illness----some of it seems to be desperation, hopelessness, and probably some psychic maladies beyond our current capacity to understand. That doesn't make it any less frightening.

Notice, that in today's scripture, the demon exists in a man right within the synagogue. Evil isn't just out there somewhere----it lives within each one of us. If we're honest with ourselves, we know that we're in a continual battle to know and do the right thing. To quote that great comic strip theologian, Pogo, "We have met the enemy, and he is us!"

In Mark's gospel, one of the dominant themes is the continual tension between God's presence in Jesus and the various powers of evil. Jesus doesn't just wave a magic wand and eradicate all the disease and demons of the world. Certainly, God would have the power to do so if that were God's way. Yet we are left to fight the good fight----with the wickedness we see around us----and also within.

Notice in today's text that the demon knows who this Jesus is----far better than the gathered crowd. Here it is, very early in Mark's gospel

and almost immediately Jesus is confronted with the presence of evil----and the demon seems like he's trying to negotiate-----"what have you
to do with us?"-----in other words, why don't you leave us be and go
do your holy stuff! But Jesus from the git go wants full command----evil is to be defeated, and it starts with this one poor possessed soul.

And it's like that for us also. Jesus wants full possession of our lives----he wants us to be possessed-----but it has to come with our cooperation-----our desire and our openness to God's Spirit taking control in our lives. If there's one thing imbedded in my preaching these past four years with you-----it's that God is persistently pursuing us so that we might live in faith and be people of love, goodness, and mercy. It's not easy------like the presence of the unclean spirit in this man at the synagogue in today's gospel------there are lots of demons both within and around us. And often the choices for us are not between good and pure evil----but the seemingly innocent temptations that lure us into passivity. One of my favorite quotes is: All that is necessary for the forces of evil to win the world is for enough good people to do nothing.

Faith is intentional----it is motivated-----and it is consistent. These next months for Good Shepherd will pose a challenge as you have at least a short period of time with only Sunday supply pastors. But consider it an opportunity to pull together and prepare for what is to come. Consider your loyalty and commitment to one another and to your Lord and you will be fine.

This past week in the office I was filling out the official parish record book. One of my tasks is to have that up to date, and I've never served a congregation where I had to do that task. There were always church staff that took care of that task! I was really surprised at how much has happened in these past 4+ years. We've taken in a significant number of new members, had 7 confirmations, 5 first communions and a blessed small number of funerals. You have been remarkably flexible and resilient in the face of some serious challenges and a once-in-acentury pandemic.

When faced with lemons----you've made lemonade! And it's been wonderful. I close my ministry here with deep gratitude for how good you have been to Georgia and me-----it's been an honor and privilege to serve you. I really regret that it's time for me to slow down-----but I know it's time and I am confident for your future in God's hands. Amen.

### Luke 24 - Jesus Has Risen!

On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. <sup>2</sup> They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, <sup>3</sup> but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. <sup>4</sup> While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. <sup>5</sup> In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? <sup>6</sup> He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 7 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.' " 8 Then they remembered his words. <sup>9</sup> When they came back from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the others. <sup>10</sup> It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the others with them who told this to the apostles. <sup>11</sup> But they did not believe the women, because their words seemed to them like nonsense. <sup>12</sup> Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over, he saw the strips of linen lying by themselves, and he went away, wondering to himself what had happened.

## **Property Report:**

First, "Thanks" to Dean for replacing all the trim work around the sanctuary windows, and to Sal for painting the trim, the old

entrance and handrails!

The Fellowship Hall heating and air conditioning units have been installed and are fully functional. And, the preventive maintenance has been completed on the sanctuary and parsonage units before the summer months.

We are still awaiting word from our claims agent from Church Mutual regarding the wind damage to the sanctuary roof during the storm on January 9.

We now have a device, provided by our insurance company Church Mutual, which will summon law enforcement to the church in case we have an active shooter incident. It's terrible that we have to be concerned about this, but we have to be prepared for such an event. Each Sunday, the device will be in the possession of the Audio/Streaming team or one of the ushers.

As always, if you have questions concerning the finances of Good Shepherd, please give me a call. And, I hope to see you in person or on-line for church.




#### **January Council meeting notes:** 01-14-2024

Cheryl opened the meeting with devotions and prayer.

- The Council members then welcomed our new members Marylyn, Rusty and Doug B.
- The following members were elected to positions of leadership for 2024; Doug Lindstrom (Chair), Bob Ferris (Vice Chair), Natalie Gamble (Secretary), Jon Carpenter (Financial Secretary) and Kevin Wicker (Treasurer). And, Cheryl Clayton was appointed by Council to send notes acknowledging financial gifts to the church, a responsibility that Shannon Guess has generously done since the passing of Mrs. Eleanore Gloeckler.
- Members reviewed the 2023 financial spreadsheet and then approved the 2024 Spending Plan for Ministry which will be presented to the congregation for vote on Sunday, February 4, following worship. Council also approved the replacement of both of the Heating and Air Conditioning units in the Fellowship Hall. This will also be taken to the congregation for vote on February 4.
- While discussing financial matters, members approved a
  portion of the 2023 General Fund offering be moved to the
  Wallace Fund to pay back some of the cost of the new
  Sound System. They also approved a donation to a nonprofit organization as a gift for Pastor Craig upon his
  retirement. Council then approved the new rate of
  reimbursement for our supply pastors as recommended by
  the SC Synod.
- Council approved increasing the scholarships for higher education students to \$400 per year and for young people attending summer camp at Lutheridge, Lutherock, Luthersprings, or Luther Ranch to \$500. These funds are available from the Doscher-Fellers Scholarship Fund.
- In a discussion regarding usher responsibilities, Council approved that one of the ushers will act as the second communion assistant if an acolyte is not available on communion Sundays.
- In a final matter of business, members decided they will continue to meet following worship on the second Sunday

There being no further business the meeting was closed with the Lord's prayer.
